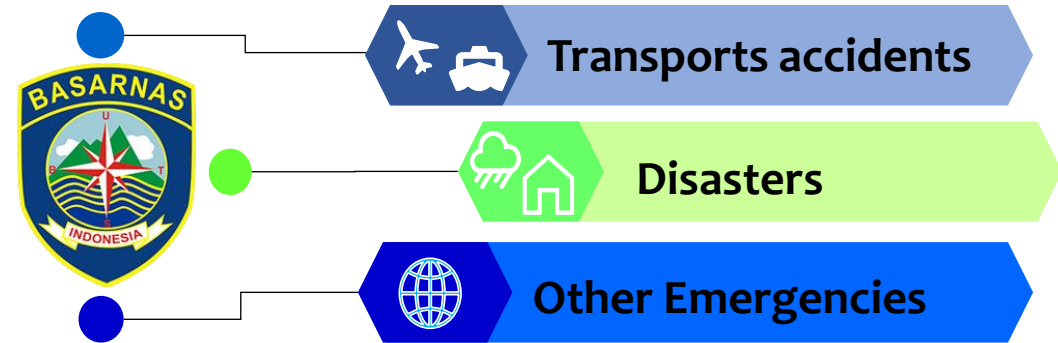

Rear Admiral Ribut Eko Suyatno bring to this job over 32 years of experience in the navy, where He has worked in a wide array of roles and responsibility.

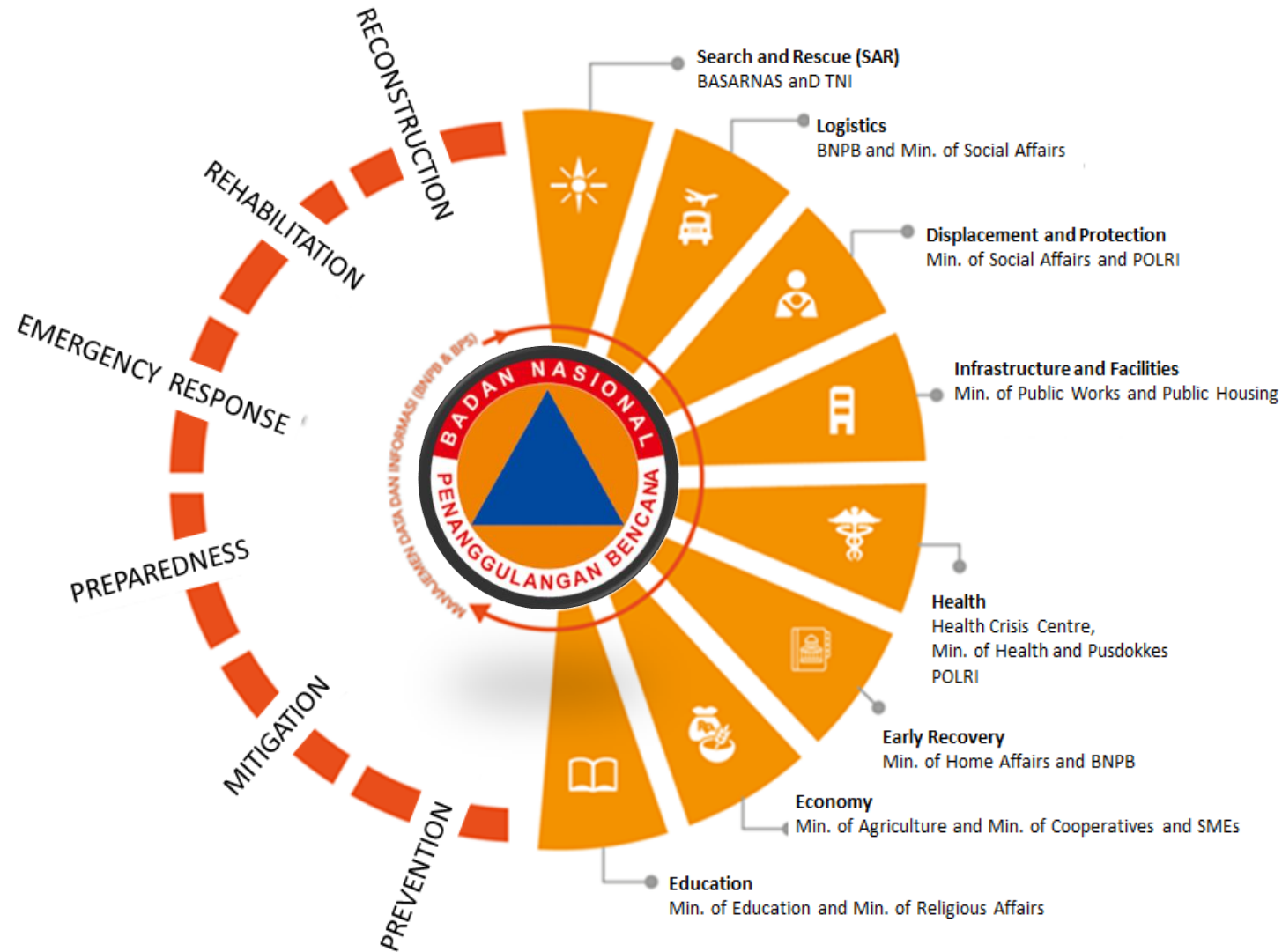
Rear Admiral Ribut Eko Suyatno holds master degree in management.

3. BASARNAS is tasked to respond aeronautical and maritime distresses, disasters in emergency response phase, and others emergencies both national and international levels
4. BASARNAS cooperates with government agencies, Indonesia armed forces (TNI), police, private sectors, NGOs and foreign SAR authorities in conduct of SAR operations



NATIONAL DISASTER MANAGEMENT CLUSTER

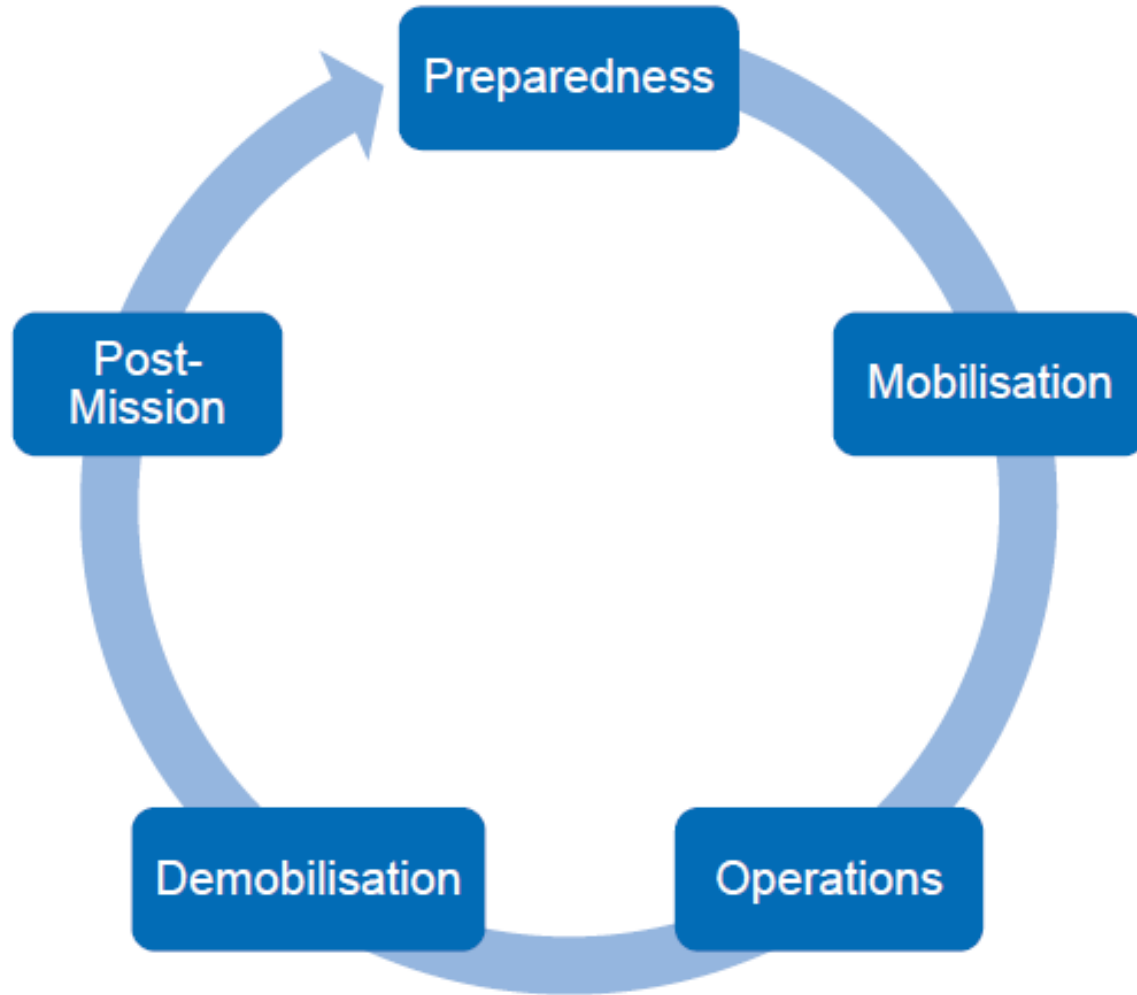

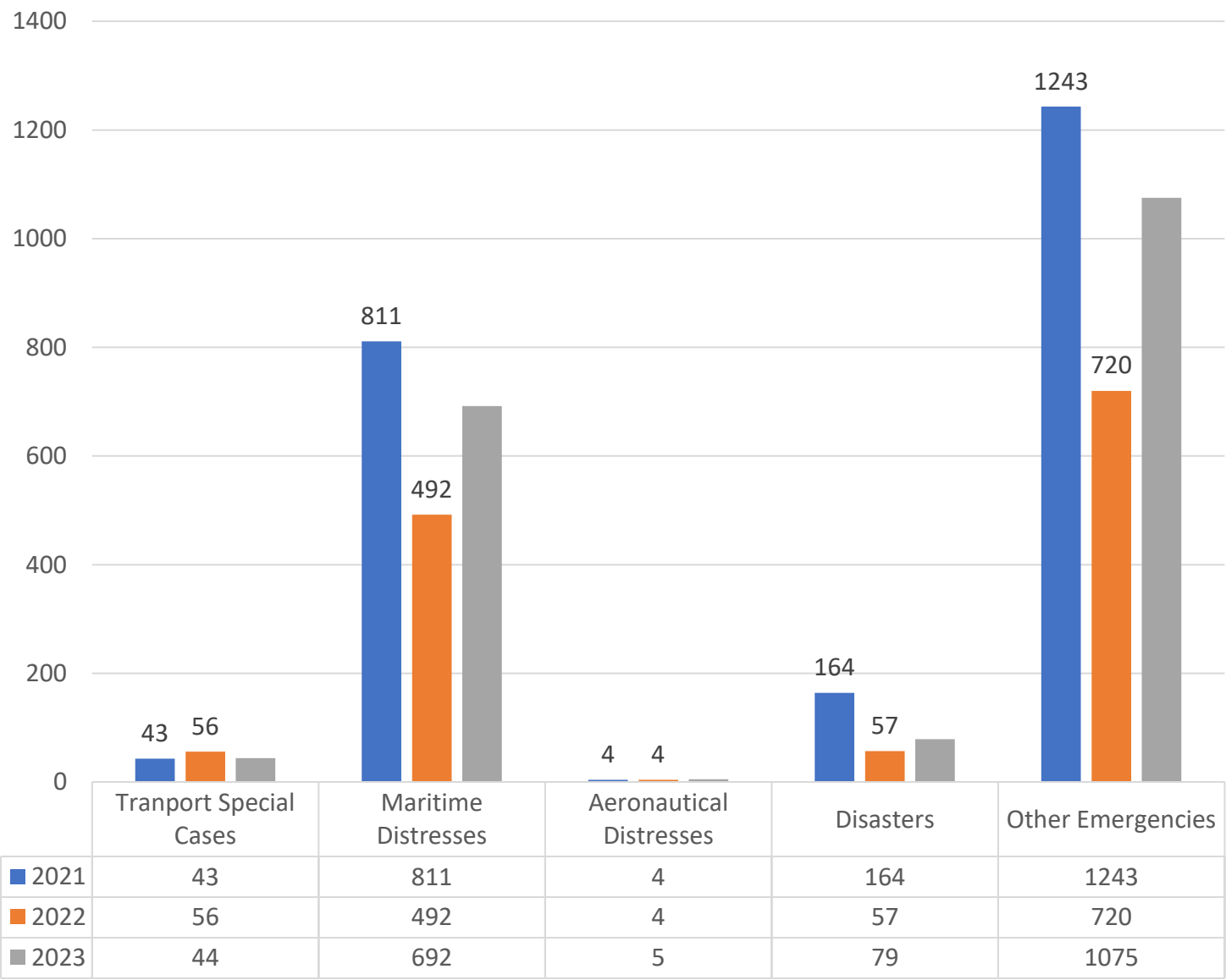
